**To download the selection, click on the song title to open the file, then click on "Save Page As" on the File Menu, and choose a place to save the file on your computer.**

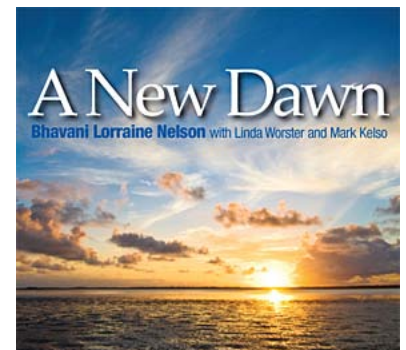
